Section 4. First Aid Measures

Description of Necessary First Aid Measures

- General Advice:** Move out of dangerous area. Consult a physician. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance.
- Eye Contact:** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Check for and remove any contact lenses. Continue rinsing.
- Skin Contact:** Wash off contaminated skin with soap and plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists.
- Inhalation:** Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband.
- Ingestion:** Rinse mouth. Remove dentures if any. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband.

Product of Combustion:	Decomposition products may include hydrogen bromide gas and magnesium oxide.
Protection of Firefighters:	Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment and Emergency Procedures

Methods for Containment

Section 7. Handling and Storage

Precautions:	Product is strongly deliquescent. Handle under an inert gas. Avoid dust formation. Avoid inhalation of dust from this material. In case of insufficient ventilation, wear suitable respiratory equipment. Guard against dust accumulation of this material. Provide appropriate exhaust ventilation in areas where dust is formed. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.
Protective Measures:	Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Do not ingest. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Avoid breathing dust. Keep in the original container kept tightly closed when not in use. Empty containers retain product residue and can be hazardous. Do not reuse container.
General Occupational Hygiene:	Eating, drinking and smoking should be prohibited in areas where this material is handled, stored and processed. Workers should wash hands and face before eating, drinking and smoking. Remove contaminated clothing and protective equipment before entering eating areas. Safe Storage Conditions:	Product is strongly deliquescent. Store in original container, protected from direct sunlight and in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area. Once opened, store under an inert gas. Store away from incompatible materials (strong oxidizing agents, water/moisture) and food and drink. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. Store locked up.

Introductory Remarks:	These recommendations provide general guidance for handling this product. Environmental Exposure Controls (cont.):

In some cases, fume scrubbers, filters or engineering modifications to the process equipment will be necessary to reduce emissions to acceptable levels.

Individual Protection Measures

Hygiene Measures:

Wash hands, forearms and face thoroughly after handling chemical products, before eating, smoking and using the lavatory and at the end of the working period. Remove all soiled and contaminated clothing immediately. Do not inhale dusts produced by product. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Ensure that eyewash stations and safety showers are close to the workstation's location.

Eye/Face Protection:

Safety eyewear complying with an approved standard should be used when a risk assessment indicates this is necessary to avoid exposure to dusts. If contact is possible, the following protection should be worn, unless the assessment indicates a higher degree of protection: chemical splash goggles, faceshield (8-inch minimum). Skin Protection

Hand Protection:

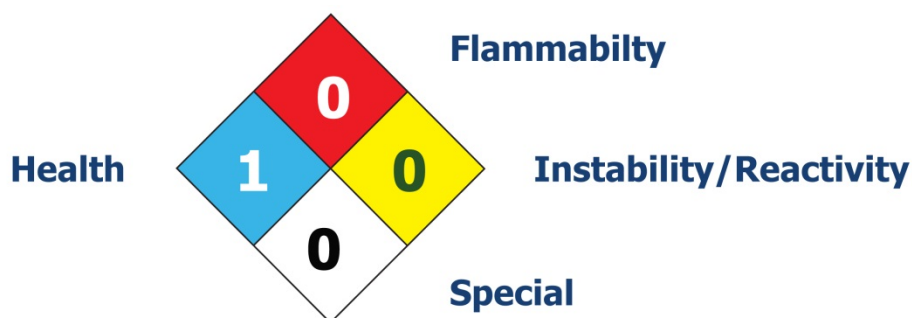
